Directives
(Effective as of July 2003)

To the Coaches:

1. Coaches will be provided with team attire, they will be required to wear these items at all games. All items are to be worn in the proper manner.
2. The association has the right to send its coaches to any clinic(s) for additional training. The club will reimburse all fees, when proof of completion is submitted.
3. The coach may be expected to perform other responsibilities that may occur throughout the year. (I.e. meetings, tournaments)
4. Coaching staff is required to show up a **Minimum** of 30 minutes prior to practices/games.
5. If any of the coaching staff cannot make the practices or games, they are to notify the other coach (if applicable) and a club board member (President or Vice President).
6. The coaching staff will provide fundamental training of the game. This shall include, but not limited to the following: Stick Handling, Passing, Checking and the concept of **TEAM** play and give constructive criticism when needed.
7. Coaches are expected to follow any rules set by the club, league or tournaments in which they play and any governing bodies of the sport of hockey.
8. Coaches are required to bring team supplied water bottles, first aid kit, and any other items necessary to all games/practices. Replacement of team equipment is the responsibility of the coach if lost.

To the Players

1. Players will be expected to have a neat personal appearance at games/practices. Game attire will be consisting of team-designated apparel.
2. Players will have appropriate team uniforms at all games. Dark Jersey/Dark Socks, White Jersey/White Socks, helmets and pants dark (black/navy blue) will be required starting the 2003/2004 season.
3. If a player is late to a game, and the game has all ready started, that player will sit out the period if the coach deems necessary.
4. If a player is unable to make it to a game or practice, or will be late, it is his or the parents responsibility to inform the coaching staff.
5. Players are expected to arrive a **Minimum** of 30 minutes prior to games/practices unless otherwise instructed by the coach.
6. Players, who participate in any other school activity during the hockey season, shall provide the coaching staff and the club with a schedule of those events
7. If a player is injured and under a doctors care, they are required to get a release before they can play in any other games/practices.
8. If a player becomes disruptive during a practice or game the coach has the right to bench that player one game, but the coach has to inform the board of his action.

Any player in violation of the Rules of Conduct will be reviewed by the board and may face suspension or ejection from the team. **(See Rules of Conduct)**
