## Fraxel re:pair launch

US dermatologist and past president of the American Society for Lasers in Surgery and Medicine (ASLMS) Dr Suzanne Kilmer was the guest speaker at the May launch of the Fraxel re:pair laser in Sydney.

The Fraxel re:pair system provides the industry's first deep dermal ablation treatment for wrinkles, sagging skin, acne scarring and sun damage.

Dr Kilmer said the Fraxel re:pair system produces significant tissue tightening, wrinkle reduction both on and off the face. 'In my 20 years of using lasers, I have not seen an ablative technology safely capable of targeting loose skin, severe sun damage and surgical scars,' she said.

A presentation was also made by Dr Jack Ting, Australia's first cosmetic doctor to own a Fraxel re:pair system. He said the treatment is a breakthrough in the cosmetic laser arena, and the results approach tightening and wrinkle removal that are normally seen only after a facelift. 'I can now offer my patients the results of a CO<sub>2</sub> laser treatment, but with significantly less discomfort and down time,' he said.

Maria Barra, the first patient in Australia to have a full face treatment with Fraxel re:pair performed by Dr Ting, said she noticed the dramatic difference in her skin. 'My skin hasn't looked this good in 20 years,' she said. 'It feels like a baby's skin.'
